

Message From The Provincial Grand Master

Brethren,

There are three major events for the Province to join together and celebrate in different ways. We start in March with our Grand Lodge visit and Second Degree ceremony, followed in June with the Peterborough Parade in regalia and service of celebration at the Cathedral and concluding in October, with the Gala Dinner at Wicksteed Park, Kettering.

Also, there are many local events taking place in the various Centres throughout the Province, providing a wide range of opportunities for all brethren to celebrate 300 vears of Freemasonry together at some point during the year.

This project naturally has my full support and I would ask if anyone has an inclination to assist in any way, to contact WBro Ged. Further information is shown later in this edition.

At the Three Counties meeting in October, I updated Brethren on progress in respect of our Sheaf Close complex. After a tremendous amount of work by WBro Barry Howard and his team, planning permission has now been aranted for the building of a Care Home on the spare land at the side of our building. Whilst this has cost a considerable amount of money, around £50,000, it will prove money well spent as we are now able to offer this as a development opportunity to builders specialising in

this sector. I can report that a serious offer has been made and is now under consideration by the board of directors. I am confident once a deal is concluded, we will have a situation of no debt and a substantial amount in our bank account, thus

our bank account, thus guaranteeing the financial security of Northampton Freemasonry for years to come.

Within the 2017 New Year's Honours list, I was delighted to see recognition for VWBro James Newman who was appointed an Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire (OBE). James is the Deputy President and Chairman of the new Masonic Charitable Charity and, of course, a member and past master of the Old Wellingburian Lodge which meets at Wellingborough.
I congratulate him on his award and also his work on behalf of us all.

To all Brethren, I send my very best wishes and hope you enjoy the remainder of this season, making the most of the special opportunities our Tercentenary year will bring. I look forward to Provincial Grand Lodge and the Three Counties promotions meetings in May, and meeting with as many of you as I can. 2017 is a significant year in our history and one I am sure we will look back on with great pride.

For 19 years
Freemasonry has been a
part of my life in one
way or another; my
father was initiated into
Trinity Lodge in April
1998 and my interest
piqued immediately. "Is
there a secret
handshake?" "Can you
only get in with a
password?" were some
of the questions I
remember asking.

Fast forward to April 2010 to the night of my initiation and at just nineteen years old I joined one of the oldest and largest fraternities in the world.

Being a Lewis wasn't my only reason for joining, however. I wanted to develop my knowledge of Freemasonry, how Freemasons conduct themselves and their meetings and the sorts of things they can achieve, as well as developing myself as a person in an ever changing society in which a three hundred year old system of morality still applies.

My first couple of years as a Freemason were, as I believe, the same as anyone else's, developing an understanding each month but still having more and more questions. I was passed and raised within twelve months and with the help of my Father and other senior members within, not just my own lodge, but the

Province as a whole, it all started to come together. I was invited to visit other lodges and even made it down to Great Queen Street.

My life is full of challenges, I jump out of aeroplanes for a living

parachute off of cliffs as a hobby; after landing safely I don my suit and apron and take up the office of Junior Deacon in my lodge. Being a Freemason may be so far from the adrenalin of such sports, but conducting a candidate around the lodge for their raising or performing a piece ritual in front of an audience who have been doing this since before I was born can certainly get the blood pumping.

The fact that Freemasonry can be as much of a challenge as you make it is



one of the many reasons I enjoy being a member and an officer of the lodge. I like to push myself to learn ritual and progress but coupled with all the friends I have made we never fail to have fun, have a laugh and a few drinks and thoroughly enjoy the evening.

The 3 Pillars - Feeding the Homeless Trust

The 3 Pillars Trust has been established following a recent article in 'Freemasonry Today' where two Brethren from West Lancashire set up a charity to feed the homeless. WBro Mick Pescod contacted the two Brethren concerned and joined them in Peterborough with a view to support this initiative. WBro Ged Dempsey then ioined WBro Mick shortly after at the feeding station and that's how it all began.

It was clear to both Ged and Mick that there was a real need in the community for this type of initiative and that Masonry could make a significant contribution to supporting this within our Province.

The decision was made to have a standalone charity that would be run by masons and managed by masons putting
'Freemasonry right
into the heart of the
Community'. This was a
real opportunity for
Freemasons to not only
contribute financially but
to actually do day-to-day
work.

A van has been purchased and they hope to have this converted into a 'Catering Van' which will allow them to cook and warm food up on site. At present, the charity operates every Tuesday and Thursday at the Brewery Tap car park in Peterborough City Centre and has been there since September 2016. What started off as

a trickle of 10-12 people has now grown significantly, with between 50-60 feeding and are offered clothes, blankets and sleeping bags. Bro Lee Garner and his wife April have been a major help in getting this set up and they have been there almost every night.

The name is clearly Masonic 'The 3 Pillars -Feeding The Homeless Trust' and the objective is to: 'provide for those people (who are many) living on the streets in towns and cities with food, bedding and clothes'. It is expected that Masons will be the major contributors, however, it will not preclude nonmasons from contributing financially or assisting by manning the feeding



stations and with donations of food, blankets, sleeping bags or clothes - this is already happening. Many of the Lodges have made spontaneous financial donations and assistance in other ways.

A number of businesses have agreed their support, as well as continuing to give by donating money, clothing and bedding along with their time.

The Charity will also work with other similar organisations who have thus far been extremely helpful in guiding and supporting the start-up of this project, namely Karen Dunn and Nikki Lightfoot-Fulcher – 'Helping Huntingdon Homeless and surrounding areas'.

Wbro Ged said, "We are always looking for additional volunteers who are prepared to help - in particular; nurses, chiropodists and paramedics, any other people with skills that can help people.

"The plan is to ensure that the first phase is stable and works and that we can extend the cover to do more nights and even weekends once we have the first van converted to a 'Catering Van'. It is planned that the vans will be liveried up with Masonic graphics creating a visible presence in the community for

Freemasonry. Once this foundation is established, we want to acquire more vans and extend this project to cover the major towns and cities within the Province of Northamptonshire and Huntingdonshire in so doing establish a lasting contribution to people in need and truly taking Freemasonry into the community. This will be a wonderful legacy to leave in our Tercentenary Year."

Passing to the Grand Lodge Above of WBro Jim Parker PAGDC

We are very sad to announce the passing of WBro John James (Jim) Parker, PAGDC. WBro Jim was initiated into Old Northamptonian Lodge No. 5694 in November 1974. He was also a member of Palmer Lodge of Provincial Grand Stewards No. 8995, and founder member of Webb Ellis Lodge No. 9740, and an honorary member of Grand Junction Lodge No. 9775 and England's Centre Lodge No. 2555. He was also a member of Northampton Chapter No. 360.

During his career, WBro Jim held several acting ranks: ProvGStwd in 1989, ProvAGDC in 1993

and ProvSGW in 2003. He became a Grand Officer in 2005 when he was promoted to the rank of Past Assistant Grand Director of Ceremonies. Jim was a Group Officer for Northampton and Chairman of Freemasons' Hall Northampton Ltd. In relation to Holy Royal Arch, WBro Jim was given an acting rank of Prov2ndAGSoi in 1999. He was promoted to PPGSN in 2004.

WBro Jim made a substantial contribution to Freemasonry during his career and his good friend WBro John Denton wrote - If Jim had a motto it would have been "controlled irreverence". He was great fun. As Master, Director of Ceremonies and Chaplain of the Old Northamptonian Lodge he was superb. As Director of Ceremonies the Festive Board was strictly controlled, interspersed with lots of laughs".

News From Provincial Grand Lodge

The Life of Alfred Cockerill - Businessman, Philanthropist, Councillor and Freemason.

As we celebrate 300 years of Freemasonry, we reflect on the story of Alfred Cockerill, who in 1858 as a 16 year old, set out from his home near Lutterworth `poor and penniless` in search of work and through his life`s achievements, his legacy lives on in our Province today, over 150 vears later..... Alfred was born in the village of Shawell. Leicestershire in 1842 and unable to find work, walked to Northampton Town with little more than a determination to succeed. He managed to find a home in Barry Road and started to grow vegetables on land nearby, selling produce on Northampton market. A few years later, he was approached by two prominent local Solicitors. who respecting Alfred's ability for hard work, suggested he take over a vacant shop. Declaring he had no capital, they

offered to back him and in 1864 he opened his first shop in the Drapery, soon to become the leading greengrocer in the Town. Alfred joined Freemasonry in 1875 and was initiated into Pomfret Lodge aged 33, where he progressed through the ranks becoming Worshipful Master in 1888. He was elected Provincial Grand Treasurer in 1890, a post he held for a number of vears. As Alfred`s

business expanded, he started to purchase land to grow more produce. With the break-up of the Abington Estate in 1892, he acquired significant plots, including a 10 acre field near Abinaton Lane (now Avenue) and with the Town Cricket Club searching for new facilities, Alfred offered it on a 21 year lease. Alfred committed to `fork, plough, level and seed the around' and in 1886 the first cricket

match took place, two decades before Northamptonshire being admitted to the County Cricket Championship. And so the County Ground was born, with both the 'County' & the `Cobblers` sharing the ground. However, in 1921 when the Sports and Recreation Company encountered financial difficulties, Alfred stepped in providing significant help and creating The Cockerill Masonic Trust. administered by Pomfret Lodge. Public life beckoned and when Alfred was elected Councillor for Kingsthorpe, then a village, this started over 30 years of public service culminating in him becoming an Alderman of Northampton. In 1901, having owned land on the corner of

Billing Road for some time, Alfred moved to the mock Tudor house he had built there. The

Northampton Town

and County Grammar School subsequently moved to the new school built opposite in 1911 and so commenced a close association. On his death in 1927, Alfred left his house to his nephew with the proviso if sold, it must be offered first to the school. This took place and for many vears `The Old School House' was the residence of the Headmaster and still carries the initials AC on its weathervane. Alfred also owned the


adjacent 22 acre site and again this was offered to and purchased by the school. Today, it is owned by the Old **Northamptonians** Association and has developed into one of the major amateur sportina venues in the Town. There are memorials within the Town to the work. kindness and philanthropy of Alfred, including Abington Churchyard and of course, Sheaf Close.



Operation Christmas Child

Christmas is a time for giving and in the true spirit of the occasion De La Pre Lodge 1911, in Northampton has contributed 14 boxes to Operation Christmas Child.

Since 1990, more than 124 million boys and girls in over 150 countries have experienced a shoebox of Christmas gifts through the project - run by a Christian Charity called Samaritan's Purse. Churches of several denominations and many schools have been involved around the world.

The project was proposed by WBro Mike Walsh - with the Lodge donating £230, initially to put together 10 boxes. He and Bro Lukasz Kusiak, also of De La Pre, then bought all the items, decorated the boxes and packed them. A combination of canny buying and

additional personal generosity by members and visitors to the lodge took the final tally to 14.

There are no strings attached to the gifts and, significantly for Freemasons, the inclusion of anything of a religious or political nature is explicitly banned. Children in warzones, famine hotspots and other areas of need -

including refugees and those experiencing poverty and deprivation - receive a box that is recommended to include toys and more prosaically basic toiletries.

Northampton as a whole contributes about 2000 boxes annually to the appeal.

Lodge of Research Banner dedication

On the 16th January 2017. The Provincial Grand Master, RWBro Max Bayes and his team carried out a banner dedication for the Richard Sandbach Lodge of Research No 9600.

The late Past Provincial Grand Master's son, WBro Dickon Sandbach gave an explanation of the history of the banner and the contents of the Coat of Arms.

The Banner was made, originally, at the time that RWBro Richard Sandbach was Provincial Grand Master of the Province of Northamptonshire and Huntingdonshire and was used to accompany him into Provincial Grand Lodge.

The Banner depicts the Armorial Bearings, or Coat of Arms, in its Scottish matriculation of RWBro Richard Sandbach and the formal description is as follows:

[A Shield] Vert, a saltire engrailed and on a chief Or a stag's head Caboshed Proper, between two garbs Gules. Above the shield is placed an Helm befitting his degree with a Mantling Vert doubled Or, and on a Wreath of the Liveries is set for Crest a stag's head proper attired Or, within six

garbs alternately Or and Gules, and in an Escrol; over the name, this Motto "Fight On"

The motto was his personal motto, and represents the need to "Fight On" and not be subdued by adversity, which he adopted during the war.

In his dedication address, the Provincial Grand Chaplain, WBro Rev'd John Simmons, explained the design of Coritani's banner which reflected the similar thought processes followed when the name 'Coritani' was chosen.

The Image on the banner portrays Boudicca in her chariot whilst the Motto, 'KERENSA BRODER' translates as 'Brotherly Love'.
